P4C Question: In order to develop children's critical thinking skills and to reflect on their own views and those of others, this week's P4C question is:


Is one person's trash another one's treasure?

Summer Holiday Geography Homework: When the children have their class swaps this week with their new teachers, they will be told all about their Summer Holiday Geography Homework. We would like them to **send a postcard to their class** all about where they visit on holiday! They need to write the postcard to their class, tell them where they went, which country/continent it was in, the capital city, the language they speak, what food they eat, anything else that's special about it and of course what they did there!

If they're not going away they can send a postcard from somewhere that they go to for the day (the beach, a city/town, a tourist attraction). Or if a relative is going away somewhere interesting the children can ask them to send a postcard to the school all about it and your child can then design their own postcard. The homework and all the details will be in their homework folder. If they design their own postcard they need to bring it in on **Monday 5th September 2022** to share it with the class.

Geography field trip: As the very final outing for our current year 6 children here at Cranbrook they undertook a geographical fieldwork study looking at the local environment. You might have seen them around in their Hi-Viz jackets! The children studied the pedestrian flow in the local area, the variety of traffic passing the school and the quality of the environment. You will be pleased to know that amongst other things the children observed that there was very low litter and graffiti and that nature has been used effectively to enhance the local area. Next year we plan for more such fieldwork activities right across the school. Please support the children in their geographical exploration with local walkarounds looking at the physical and human features of their neighbourhoods.

School Uniform Information in preparation for September 2022

At Cranbrook, pupils are expected to wear full uniform when participating in learning and at all school events both within and outside of the normal school day (unless stipulated by the school). We believe wearing uniform helps children to develop a strong group identity and a sense of loyalty to their school, as well as encouraging a pride in their appearance. Working with parents, carers and guardian we aim to ensure that all children arrive to school appropriately dressed for safety and weather conditions.

Girls:

Jade round neck sweatshirt with school logo, dark grey skirt, pinafore or trousers and white polo shirt (with or without school logo). In summer girls can wear a green and white check dress.

Boys: Jade round neck sweatshirt with school logo, dark grey trousers and white polo shirt (with or without school logo). In summer dark grey smart shorts can be worn. No jogger, jeans or leggings to be worn as trousers.

Nursery: As above (sweatshirt and white polo shirt) with dark grey trouser or jogging bottoms if preferred.

Footwear

Sensible flat black shoes or boots in winter – trainers, flip-flops or backless sandals or shoes are not acceptable.

Hair Accessories: Girls must wear conservative hair accessories in green, black and white without embellishments.

Footwear: Sensible flat black shoes or boots in winter – trainers, flip-flops or backless sandals or shoes are not acceptable.

Children must wear dark grey socks and tights.

PE Kits: Plain crew neck t-shirt in the colour of the child's class – red, blue, yellow or green. Plain black jogging bottoms or shorts in summer and a plain black sweatshirt for colder weather. Astro Turf football trainers will be used for both indoor and outdoor PE.

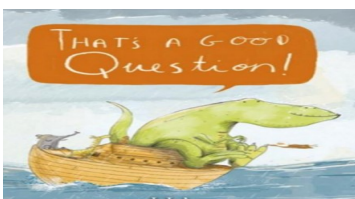
